

FIRST CLUB OFFICIAL OF THE YEAR AWARDED

A role that often requires long hours and certainly dedication to the sport Bowls WA was pleased for the first time to recognise the officials who contribute so much to our game with the inaugural Club Official of the Year Award.

The award is directed towards the Match Committee and Umpires of our clubs that enable the vast majority of bowlers to simply to turn up and play.

The winner has spent not only the previous season in both these roles but many years, that person being **Patsy** Smith from Halls Head Bowling Club.



Bowls WA Board Member Vince Del Prete presented Patsy with her trophy on the night.

Patsy said her journey as an umpire basically started out through educating herself around the rules of the game, adding that her husband pointed out when she took on the role of Vice Captain after just a few years playing that she should get a rule book and learn the rules if she wanted to do the job properly. "So I did that but I wasn't an umpire and I really did study that book, so much that I thought I knew my rules really well." Said Patsy. "We had very experienced bowlers who sometimes disagreed with me, so I thought I better do my umpires course." Which of course added the credence she needed when issues around the rules arose. As Master of Ceremonies Clive Adams noted Patsy has been an umpire for many, many, years with her knowledge no longer in question.

Patsy has also worked hard to help not only her club but many others in developing a software program called PAMI which assists in generating draws for round robin carnivals, she has worked on Match Committee at her club understanding the importance of how competitions are run successfully. She also noted that the club has a big project happening at the moment, specifically around mentoring, etiquette, and helping new bowlers. Something which she is helping with, and feels is very important for her club given how large it has grown.

A tremendous contributor to our sport and a well deserved winner as our first Club Official of the Year we say well done once again to Patsy Smith.

Patsy Smith Halls Head HEROES

O1 How long have you been playing Lawn Bowls?

Bill and I moved North Fremantle 1996. He joined North Fremantle. I didn't play bowls at

that time and was a bit lost so Bill suggested I go to bowls with him. North Fremantle had very few ladies so we both joined Mosman Park 1998 and I joined him there. Ray Dalziel was my first coach.

O2 Have you always bowled at HH or if not where did you bowl previously?

In January 2000 we moved to Mandurah as my elderly father was living here. I had just finished my novice years at Mosman Park. We intended to join Dudley Park, however I had been advised to check out Halls Head and this we did. We were met at the door by the very friendly Mary Chalmers, who offered Bill a red wine and at Halls Head we stayed.

Q3 What do you feel is your greatest achievement in Lawn Bowls?

Undoubtedly, it was winning the inaugural open singles Novice Championship at Osborne Park in April 2000. We were still members at Mosman Park and travelling back and forth until the end of the season.

The inaugural event was knockout and very well supported with 69 competitors, played over three days.

Bill came with me each day as did Maureen Harkin and Therese Hastings. Maureen and Therese had a roster so at all times one of them was there with me. When I made the finals I was incredibly nervous. When I made my acceptance speech I was so excited they couldn't shut me up.

Therese arranged for me to be given a copy of the draw and my score card which I still have. Playing in the same event was none other than Kaye Sewell, the Pingelly novice. Here we are 23 years on, both at Halls head and playing lots of bowls together.

I could mention here my worst event. It was my first ILRR pairs. Absolute disaster.

Q4 Who is your bowling hero and why?

I couldn't name just one.

Maureen Harkin and Therese Hastings are at the top of my list, not only for their achievements but for the support they gave me in my novice years. Eve Manton, was another player whom I held in high regard. She lived across from my dad, and shared her knowledge with me when I took on Vice Captain's role at the AGM 2001.

Q5 What is the best piece of advice you would offer a new bowler?

Don't spend hours practicing your faults. Get a good coach who will guide your practice. Learn to play the team game. Scroungers is a wonderful practice game but being a good team player is more rewarding so come to other social bowls and put your name down for pennants in your first year.

Bill gave me this advice when I started. "Don't dwell on your good bowls, be mindful of the number of bad bowls you are playing".

Q6 What is the best thing about being a member of HHBC?

There is no doubt that it is the friends I have made and the opportunities I have been given.
