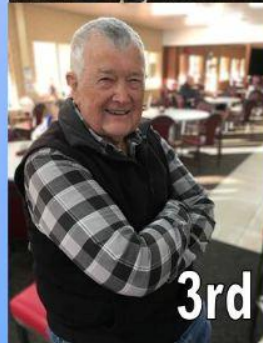
Scroungers Results
