Outside Lockers

Hi members, most of you will have noticed the new addition of 40 lockers on the "B" Green side of the club house.

Pending renumbering and securing to the building they will be available for use.

At the moment we have around 30 people put their names down for a locker allocation so if you are keen you should see the girls in the front office.

The lockers are big enough for the modern bowls bags along with "arms". Some have movable shelves, some don't.

When paying your money it's probably a good idea to

indicate whether you want a bottom or top locker given bags are often quite heavy to lift. Ladies will be given first preference for bottom lockers.

Outside Lockers

Yearly Cost \$30.00

Prorata cost now till the next seasons billing \$15.00 (this needs to be paid at the time of allocation) As an incentive to get things moving quickly I've purchased 40 locks that will be available when you are allocated a locker.

These are a one off gift from the club...if you lose your key or the lock rusts then it becomes your responsibility to sort out. You have the option of using your own lock at any time.

The final thing I need to mention is that the club isn't insured for anything stolen or lost that is outside of the clubs premises so it's important you are aware that the risk is covered by yourself. That said the security at the club is pretty good with the gates being locked each night.


Your hopes for future?
