Jack arrived at the club on 24 th April 1993. He won his first Scrounger of the year in 1999 and went on to win this event on 10 occasions. He won the Peel Scroungers twice and also had a win in the South West Champion of Champions. Amongst all this, there was a time where he managed to gain a handicap of 18.

Jack became a Life member of our club in 2008. He has been involved in a lot more than just Scroungers with Bingo being one of his many tasks on his long list. He is one of our coaches and responsible for getting many new bowlers started in the game.

Bob Day became men's Captain in 2005 and held that position for three years. The Captain's position then involved the running of Scroungers and also the fixture book. When Bob moved on from being Captain, he retained the fixture book duties and the scroungers' role, becoming the Scroungers Coordinator. He held that role of Scroungers Coordinator until October last year. Following being Captain he became Vice President for a year and then took on men's President in 2009 for a period of 4 years. Bob was the returning officer for some years. Bob is still involved with the yearly fixture book.

Bob's role of Coordinator involved the recruiting and rostering of helpers, ensuring that there were enough resources to keep Scroungers up and running every week of the year.

Bob and Jack worked together for many years gradually making Scroungers what it is today. There was a time when the score cards were written out. They developed the rules and Jack has been an authority in this area. They both worked in the match office and also developed the Scrounger's committee as we see it today.

Wayne finished off with stating that finishing in the top two for the year in Scroungers has been elevated to everyone's wish list as it would be a great honour to win the Jack Groves or Bob Day medal.

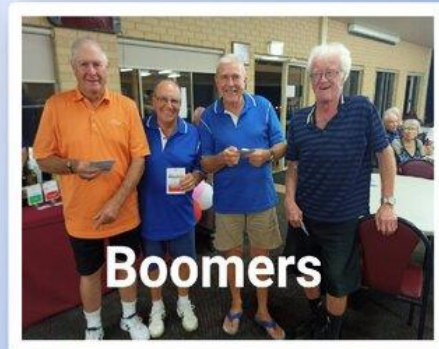
