#### SCORE CARDS

Our newer players over the last year or so have been shown by the clubs coaching staff, how to complete the scroungers score card. A photo of a recently completed card is shown below. If you are

finding the card difficult, you might find this method helpful.

Two lines have been used for each player. First line shows score for that particular end. Second line shows players progressive score and has been circled for easy recognition.

Handicaps are shown in HCP column and not subtracted from the players total until the end of the game.

At the bottom of the card the numbers 6,12,18 through to 96 for 16th end can be used to ensure your additions are correct. Please ask if you would like this clarified.

The Scorer should hand the card to the winner who is responsible to ensure the card is submitted to the match office. Winners full name is required at bottom of card.


CONGRATULATIONS to our Ladies Division 4 Pink team on winning the pennant flag for 2023/24 at Mandurah Bowling club against Boddington.
